The First Sunday in Lent

This Lent we will be exploring the riches of our Book of Common Prayer. Similar to last year, our Sunday liturgies will alternate between the Great Litany and the Penitential Rite. We will say a different Confession of Sin, Eucharistic Prayer and Post Communion Prayer. These sections come from the traditional language or Rite I in Book of Common Prayer that we do not usually use. These Rite I sections are closely connected to our larger Prayer book traditions rooted in the English Prayer Book of 1662 and the earliest English translations from the Latin that date to around 1548. What is the Great Litany?

The following is from the online Episcopal Dictionary of the Church:

An intercessory prayer including various petitions that are said or sung by the leader, with fixed responses by the congregation. It was used as early as the fifth century in Rome. It was led by a deacon, with the collects led by a bishop or priest. The Litany was the first English language rite prepared by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer. It was first published in 1544. Cranmer modified an earlier litany form by consolidating certain groups of petitions into single prayers with response. The Litany's use in church processions was ordered by Henry VIII when England was at war with Scotland and France. It was printed as an appendix to the eucharist in the 1549 BCP. The Litany was used in each of the three ordination rites of the 1550 ordinal, with a special petition and concluding collect. The 1552 BCP called for use of the Litany after the fixed collects of Morning Prayer on Sundays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

My hope for us is that this Lent, Calvary will create a space in which we can lament the things we have messed up, our transgressions and our broken relationship with God and look to Jesus who not only restores these things for us but makes us co-heirs with him as brothers and sisters in Christ.
